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THE KAY MEEK ARTS CENTRE UNVEILS PLANS FOR THE FARIS FAMILY COURTYARD

MARIE KHOURI WINS JURIED COMPETITION FOR FIRST COMMISSIONED ARTWORK AT THE KAY MEEK ARTS CENTRE

West Vancouver, B.C. – The Kay Meek Arts Centre is pleased to announce the creation of the Faris Family Courtyard as a result of Reema Faris's donation to the Centre's Capital Campaign. In addition to creating the Faris Family Courtyard, Ms. Faris's donation will fund a commissioned sculpture in honour of her mother Yulanda Faris as well as the re-landscaping of the area outside the main lobby. Internationally renowned sculptor Marie Khouri has won the juried competition for the development, production, and installation of the Centre's first commissioned public artwork.

Faris had been seeking a location for a commemorative artwork in honour of her mother, who worked on behalf of the Vancouver arts community for more than 40 years. Yulanda and her husband Moh liberally donated their time and support to opera, dance, the visual arts and literature, with a particular focus on young people, arts education, and professional training opportunities for artists. In 2010, Moh and Yulanda Faris were the recipients of a Governor General's Performing Arts Award, The Ramon John Hnatyshyn (RJH) Award for Voluntarism in the Performing Arts.

Original plans for the Kay Meek Arts Centre had included a sculpture courtyard. The launch of the Centre's capital campaign for accessibility upgrades presented a perfect opportunity to reimagine the space and garden outside the main lobby. The outstanding gift from Ms. Faris will help to realize this vision and to facilitate the improvement of exterior spaces, pathways, lighting, and landscaping as part of the comprehensive project to upgrade the Centre's amenities and physical accessibility.
